

# Board Membership

- 26 Voting members
  - 3-year terms, non-renewable
  - 8-9 openings each year
- 4-5 Officers
  - Chair, Vice Chair, 2-3 Executive Officers
- 4 Advisory Trustees (non-voting)
  - 1-year term, appointed by chair, can be reappointed
- 3 ex-officio members
  - GSAS Dean, Chair of the Graduate Student Assembly, Immediate Past Chair of GSAAB

# GSAA Full Board Meetings


#### Two meetings in New Haven

- Late November, in conjunction with University Alumni Assembly and Convocation
- March or April, in conjunction with in-person "Where Do I Go From Yale" conference

#### Four meetings on Zoom

- Alternating around in-person meetings
- One-hour in length
- Meeting agendas and pre-read materials shared one week in advance of meetings
- Board members may request up to \$300
  reimbursement for travel and hotel expenses per
  meeting, or receive tax credit for incurred expenses

# Committee Participation

#### **Committee Assignments**

- Board members share their committee interests in May; assignments are made in June.
- 1<sup>st</sup> year members serve on one committee, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year members are encouraged to serve on two.
- Committees have co-chairs (2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year members) to foster continuity.

#### **Time Commitment and Projects**

- Generally, monthly meetings via Zoom, including some during the summer; varies by committee.
- Up to 4-5 hours/week, depending on time of year and projects.
- Most committees are project-based, with each member expected to organize an event or oversee a project annually.

#### Nominations Timeline

- Applications due February 1 for the following academic year
- Members of the Nominating Committee will interview a subset of applicants in February & March
- The Board votes on the slate at spring meeting
- Successful applicants will be notified in April
- New member orientation in May/June, via zoom
- Applications are kept current for two years and may be updated for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year
